We can listen to you.



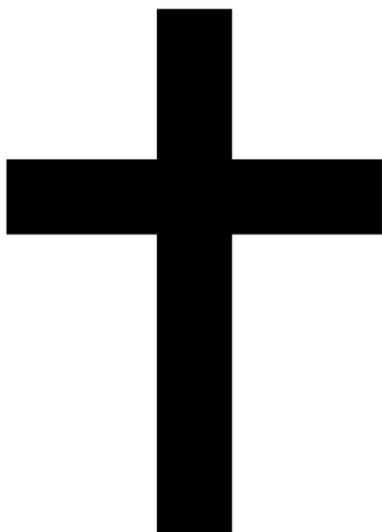
We can bring you Holy Communion.

If someone from your religion is not available, our team will visit you and do our best to help you.

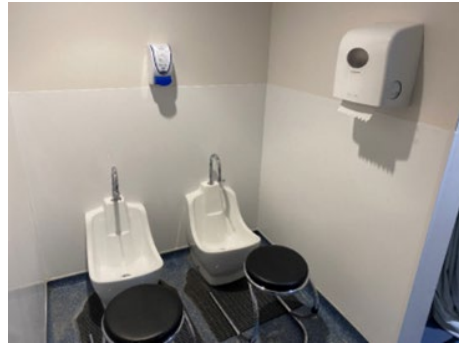
Spaces

Muslim Prayer Rooms

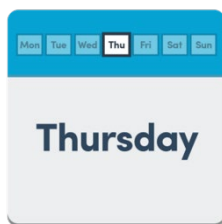
These have separate areas for men and women to wash and pray.

All our rooms are in **Blue Zone** on level 2, near Ward 21.

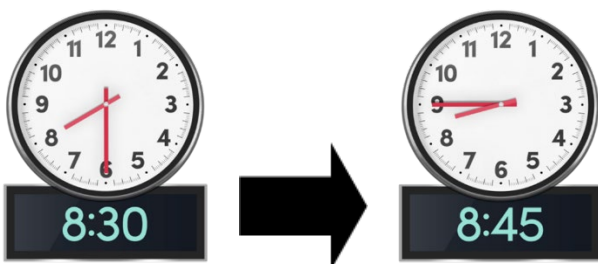
Religious Services

It is every Thursday

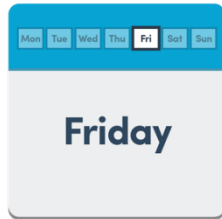


It is from 8:30am to 8:45am.

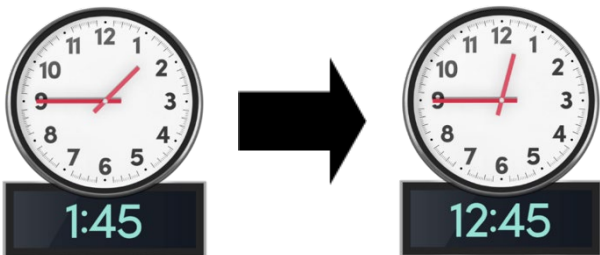


There are **Muslim Prayers** in the Chapel

The exact time changes with the sun. It is usually between 12:45pm and 1:45pm.

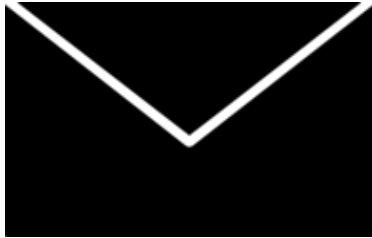
How to contact us
