Will Milton Keynes University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust be considering the replacement or purchase of any patient trolleys in the current financial year (April 2024 – March 2025), and if yes, for which hospitals/departments please? To clarify, I am referring to ED/resus/trauma trolleys, endoscopy trolleys, theatre/recovery trolleys, patient transfer trolleys, and short stay ward trolleys.

The capital bid for patient trolleys has not progressed to the priority list in this FY however this does mean that individual departments will not order any as we have ageing patient trolleys.
